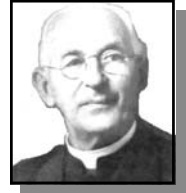

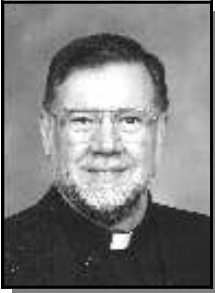
CHAPLAIN'S REPORT

Rev. Joseph Perkins

Margaret Brent, a Catholic, was born in England in 1601. She, her sister Mary, and her two brothers Giles and Fulke arrived in Maryland in 1639, five years after the founding of the colony. They were well connected to the Calvert Family, as they immediately became large landowners. Margaret never married. What is known about her is the fact that she was an able, outgoing businessperson dealing in land and cattle.

Last month I mentioned her dealings with Leonard Calvert, being named his executor on his death. Since she was his executor and a landowner herself, she went before the Assembly and requested to have two votes in matters coming before them for consideration. This request was turned down. She was not as some would think a suffragette. However, simply demanded what she thought was her right as a landowner and executor. Since she came into conflict with Lord Baltimore and the Assembly over a number of other issues, she permanently removed herself from Maryland, crossed the Potomac River and settled on Virginia's Northern Neck. She named her plantation, "Peace". She Died in 1671.

The house where she made her famous request is known as St. John's Freehold, an archeological site for many years. The rebuilt house and site will be open for visitation at Historic St. Mary's City this spring.

Pope Benedict on Saturday set the founder of the Knights of Columbus, one of the world's largest Lay Catholic groups, on the path to possible Beatification and Sainthood, the Vatican said. Life Insurance
Beneficiaries



One of the seemingly easier tasks involved in the purchase of life insurance is naming the beneficiary. An agent with pen in hand asks the applicant, "Who will get the cash?" The applicant looks at his/her spouse and without a thought replies, "My spouse, of course." However, as simple as it appears, choosing the beneficiary of a life insurance contract can be quite complex.

The beneficiary of a life insurance policy is the person named (designated) by the policy owner to receive the benefits payable when the insured dies. The right to name this beneficiary is, perhaps, the most important right the policy owner has. Generally speaking, the person who applies for insurance on his/her own life can name anyone beneficiary. Dad can name Mom, kids, parents, etc., but there are limitations. For example, in community property states, if Dad buys a policy on his life using community property funds to pay the premiums and divides the death benefits between Mom and kids, only his half of the community property death benefit may be given to the children without Mom's consent.

If the insurance is on the life of a minor, most states will not recognize the competency of minors to enter into a contract. Therefore, life insurance on a minor's life is usually owned by adult parents or other relatives. In such a case, the owner may only designate the minor, parent(s), sibling(s), child(ren) or grandparent(s) of the minor as beneficiary.

Life insurance policies owned by someone other than the insured also have restrictions on beneficiary designations. In the early history of life insurance, it was not uncommon for people to wager on the lives of others by buying life insurance on a third party without that person's knowledge or consent. This led to the nasty practice of speeding up the demise of an insured in order to collect on the death benefits. Insurers stopped this practice by requiring that owners of life insurance policies on another person only name a beneficiary who has an insurable interest in the insured. The generally accepted definition of insurable interest is "any reasonable expectation of benefit or advantage from the continued life of another person." Put simply, one might say the insured is worth more to the beneficiary alive than dead.

To qualify for insurable interest, the beneficiary may be a person related by blood or law, or someone who has a lawful or substantial economic interest in the continued life of the insured. This may include a business partner, or in the case of a corporation, the corporate entity itself for purposes of funding a partnership buy-sell or stock redemption agreement.

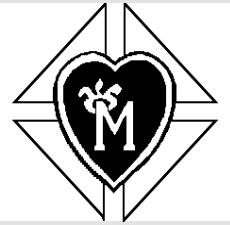
